GREEN ZEBRA (SPECIALTY HEIRLOOM TOMATO)

Popular succulent green fruits with sweet and zingy flavor.

Medium-sized fruits start out pale green with dark green stripes that soften and turn yellow when ripe. Perfect exteriors; fruits rarely crack. Ideal size for slicing into wedges for salads. Productive over a long season. For field or greenhouse

Indeterminate. 4-5 oz fruit. Days to maturity: 75-80 days. (source: JS, HM)



JAUNE FLAMME (HEIRLOOM TOMATO)

Prolific French heirloom that will set your heart on fire with its sweet, fruity flavor.

Like a grown-up Sungold with larger apricot-sized fruits that we loved in our trials. 1.5-2" fruits hang in neat clusters. A terrific salad tomato that is also great for sauces and for drying.

Indeterminate. 2-3 oz fruit. Days to maturity: 75 days. (source: Burpee, HM)



BLACK BRANDYWINE (HEIRLOOM TOMATO)

A great home garden variety.

Great-tasting tomato that is extra-large in size and full of the deep, earthy and sweet flavor. Heavy yields and vigorous plants. Superior for salsa and cooking.

Indeterminate. Days to Maturity: 80-90. (source: Rare Seeds)



BLACK PRINCE (HEIRLOOM TOMATO)

Mahogany brown with distinctive, rich, fruity tomato flavor

Unusual brown shoulders become orange-red at the blossom end. Color will be deeper and more pronounced in sunnier locations. Relatively smooth

Fruit 3-5 oz, Indeterminate, Days to maturity: 74 days

DEFIANT (SALAD TOMATO)

Early, disease resistance, and flavorful

High resistance to late blight and intermediate resistance to early blight combined with great flavor. Globe-shaped fruit are smooth and medium-firm with good texture

Indeterminate. 6-8 oz fruit. Days to maturity: 67 days. (Source: JS)



MOUNTAIN MAGIC (SALAD TOMATOES)

Excellent flavor and late blight resistance.

Produces high yields of bright red, round salad tomatoes with very sweet flavor. The uniform, sweet, crack resistant fruits are suitable for harvesting as full trusses.

Indeterminate. 2 oz fruit. Days to maturity: 66 days. (Source: JS)



MATINA (SALAD TOMATOES)

Quality small staking tomato with great flavour.

One of the tastiest early tomatoes. Healthy indeterminate plant produces deep red juicy Fruits. Potato Leaf

Indeterminate. 100-140 gram fruits. Days to maturity 65 Days. (Source: WD)



GALAHAD (SLICER TOMATO)

Delicious early beefsteak

Adaptable, high yielding with excellent disease package. Sturdy, disease resistant plants, attractive, glossy red fruit, and sweet, rich flavor. Early maturity and early blight resistance Can be harvested with green shoulders and ripened red in storage, or ripened on the vine. Vigorous plants. 7-12 oz. fruits. Determinate. Days to maturity: 69 Days.

BLACK CHERRY (CHERRY TOMATO)

Round, full-flavored cherry with distinctive purple-black color.

One inch fruits with the juicy, meaty texture and sweet, rich flavor. Very productive plants.

Indeterminate. 1-1.5 oz fruit. Days to maturity: 64 days. (source: JS, HM)



WHITE CHERRY (CHERRY TOMATO)

Pale yellow fruits.

Appealing, pale yellow cherry tomatoes have a good, mild taste. Plants are compact and easy to pick.

Indeterminate. ½-¾ oz fruit. Days to Maturity: 59. (source: JS)



YELLOW PEAR (HEIRLOOM SALAD TOMATO)

Petite, distinctive salad tomato.

Sweet, tangy yellow pear-shaped fruits. The tall, vigorous vines bear quantities of small, lemon yellow, pear-shaped fruits. Mild flavor.

Indeterminate. 0.75-1 oz fruit. Days to maturity: 70 days. (source: JS, HM)



SUN GOLD (CHERRY TOMATO)

The Intense fruity flavor can't be beat.

Exceptionally sweet, bright tangerine-orange cherry tomatoes leave you begging for more. Vigorous plants start yielding early and bear right through the season.

Indeterminate. ½-¾ oz fruit. Days to Maturity: 57. (source: JS)



BING (CHERRY TOMATO)

Exceptional rich flavor

Fruity and sweet with perfectly balanced acid, in clusters of 1" fruit. Does best in hot and dry conditions, as the thinner skin will crack with sudden rains. Harvest more frequently in wetter conditions.

Indeterminate. 1 oz fruit. Days to maturity: 65 days. (Source: HM)



GOLD NUGGET (CHERRY TOMATO)

An early, prolific, golden cherry tomato.

Round to slightly oval cherry tomatoes have a deep-yellow color. The flavor is well-balanced and delicious, and a majority of the early fruits are seedless. Healthy, compact plants with a concentrated early set.

Determinate. 15-20 gm fruit. Days to maturity 56 days (Source: JS)



WASHINGTON CHERRY (CHERRY TOMATO)

First-early determinate red cherry tomato.

High-yielding compact plants. Globe-shaped fruits have a deep-red color. Thick-walled, meaty, and flavorful, with good keeping quality on or off the vine.

Determinate. 20-25 gm fruit. Days to maturity 60 days (Source: JS)



ROMA (PASTE TOMATO)

Productive plum tomato with great disease resistance!

Vigorous and strong, producing heavy yields of picture-perfect, thick-walled fruits with deep red color and mild flavor. A good choice for a commercial variety, as well as in the garden.

Determinate. 4 oz fruit. Days to maturity: 65 days. (Source: HM)



SAN MARZANO (PASTE TOMATO)

Classic Italian favorite with high yields; excellent rich-flavored tomato for preserving.

Prized for its firm pulp, low seed count and easily-removed skin. Resists cracking and holds well both on the vine and in storage. Heavy yields.

Indeterminate, 4 oz. fruit, Days to maturity: 80 days (source: Terroir, HM)



GOLDIE (GROUND CHERRY)

Sweet, tropical-tasting gold berries wrapped in paper husks add magic to your garden.

The flavor is quite sweet and a bit wild. Plants are profusely branching, prolific. Fruits can be eaten raw, dried like raisins, frozen, canned, or made into preserves, cooked pies, and desserts. When ripe, the husk around the fruit becomes papery dry and the fruit falls off the plant to be picked up from the ground.

Days to maturity: 75 days. (source: JS, HM)



PING TUNG LONG (EGGPLANT)

Easy-to-grow heirloom Asian eggplants excellent for containers.

Long and slender with tender magenta skin. Productive plants yield up to 20 fruits each and are vigorous and stress tolerant with a compact habit. Slim fruits average 1-2" wide; plants should be staked for straight fruit. No peeling required.

Days to maturity: 60 days (Source: HM)



LISTADA DIGANDIA (EGGPLANT)

Delicious magenta-striped Italian Eggplant

Very productive plants produce abundant tender fruits with unusually thin skin. Egg-shaped petite fruits fit in the palm of your hand and are great for smaller portions. Holds its color even at large sizes.

3-5" fruit. Days to maturity: 85 days. (Source: HM)



TURKISH DELIGHT (EGGPLANT)

Easy to grow - a wonder in the kitchen.

Elongated shape and minimal seeds for quick cooking and rich flavor. Prolific yields of highly uniform, straight fruit with rich flavor. Parthenocarpic. Spineless.

8-10" long fruit. Days to maturity: 60 days. (Source: JS)



CARMEN (SWEET BULLHORN PEPPER)

Best-tasting Italian frying pepper.

A beautiful pepper of the Italian "bull's horn" (corno di toro) type. Carmen has a lovely, sweet taste for salads and roasting, especially when partially or fully red-ripe. Tapered fruits ripen from green to deep carmine red. Maturity is early on an upright, medium-size plant.

avg. 6" long x 2 1/2" wide fruit, 5 oz. (142 gm). Days to Maturity or Bloom: 60 green, 80 red ripe. (source: JS)



KING OF THE NORTH (BELL PEPPER)

Reliable set of green to glossy red fruits in short seasons

Blocky, thick-walled, early ripening peppers each with three to four lobes. Known for its ability to produce good sized peppers in short, cool seasons. Strong plants support heavy yields

3-4" fruits. Days to maturity 57 DAYS Green. (Source: HM)



BASTAN (POBLANO PEPPER)

Large, high quality dark green chiles on productive plants

Thick-walled, glossy dark green, nearly black, maturing to a deep chocolate with mild heat. Plants have an upright habit with excellent leaf cover and concentrated fruit set; extremely high yielding. Delicious roasted, stuffed, battered and fried

IKO IKO (SWEET PEPPER)

Spectacular array of colors in a high yielding bell pepper

A rainbow of colors from a single variety! Immature fruits start dark purple, lavender, pale yellow and occasionally lime green, ripening to tangerine and red streaked with purple.

3.5" fruit. Days to maturity: 65 days. (Source: HM)



HUNGARIAN HOT WAX (BANANA PEPPER)

Widely adapted and productive, even in cool weather.

Hot pepper with smooth, waxy fruits tapering to a point. Easy to stuff and to peel after roasting; thick-fleshed for frying. Its sunset-ripening peppers change from yellow to orange to red, and make the prettiest pickled peppers

5 1/2 x 1 1/2 " Fruit. Days to maturity: 58 pale yellow; 83 red ripe. (Source: JS, WD)



JALAFUEGO (JALAPENO PEPPER)

One of the hottest Jalapeno varieties.

Vigorous plants consistently produce very high yields. The peppers are very dark green in the stage when they are usually eaten. The plants are large and sturdy

3 1/2 to 4" fruits. Days to Maturity: 70 green, 93 red ripe. (source: JS, Pepper Seeds)



RED FLAME (CAYENNE PEPPER)

High yielding Ristra-type cayenne

Fruits are avg. 6-6 1/2" long with sweet-hot taste that dry quickly. Productive plant.

Days to maturity: 80 days. (Source: JS)



THAI (THAI CHILIS)

Exclusive! We got those seeds from one of our friends who got them from Thailand!

Hot thai chili used fresh at both green and red stages. Can be dried for hot pepper flakes or mini ristras. Plants are productive, big, and upright.



LEMON (HEIRLOOM CUCUMBER)

Specialty variety prized by chefs for its delicate flavor and crunchy bite.

Round fruits turn from pale greenish yellow to lemon yellow (the best eating stage) and then bright golden yellow (when it most closely resembles a lemon). Easy to grow; does well in short seasons. Great for large containers! Tolerates cool weather

3" fruits. Days to maturity: 68 days. (Source: HM, JS)



MARKETMORE 76 (SLICER CUCUMBER)

A standard for home gardeners.

Dark green fruits stay green and mild-tasting even under heat stress, while multiple disease resistances keep plants vigorous and highly productive across a long picking season.

8-9" fruits. Days to Maturity: 58 days. (source: Burpee, HM)



NORTHERN PICKLING (PICKLING CUCUMBER)

Perfect choice for small gardens

A long-time favorite, high-yielding, early cucumber. Short, compact, space saving vines. Medium-green cucumbers stay small for pickling

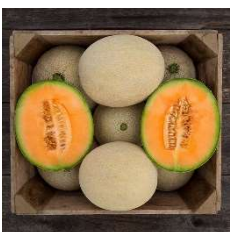
BLACKTAIL MOUNTAIN (WATERMELON)

Great melon for short, cool seasons with crisp, sweet flesh.

Solid dark green rind and crimson flesh. Fruit averages 8" across. Vines reach 10'. Excellent keeping quality and yields. Harvest just before ripe and melons will finish off in storage 6-10 lb fruit

TRUE LOVE (CANTALOUPE MELON)

High-sugar melon with near perfect texture

The aromatic sweetness of this melon evokes the feelings of true love. Melons are full slip, meaning they are ripe when they slip off the vine easily. 2-3 lb fruit

WESTLANDER (KALE)

Very curly, broad leaves with tender texture.

Extremely cold-hardy variety with large, flavorful leaves. Densely ruffled blue-green leaves with uniform size and shape. Very cold-tolerant.

RED RUSSIAN (KALE)

Smooth green, purple-veined leaves for baby leaf and bunching.

Leaves are tender, smooth and very sweet compared to other kales. An incredibly cold tolerant variety that improves in flavor with cold weather.

LACINATO (KALE)

Tender Kale on extremely vigorous plants,

Ideal for raw kale salads and soups. Leaves are very dark blue-green and heavily savoyed, sweetening with each frost. Also known as Dinosaur or Tuscan kale.

GREEN MACHINE (ZUCCHINI)

This vigorous variety produces nearly flawless cylindrical fruits daily in the high season.

Open and upright habit for ease of harvest and disease resistances that keep plants healthy for the long haul (Source: HM)



YELLOWFIN (ZUCCHINI)

Uniform, cylindrical fruits with bright yellow coloration.

Pure gold-colored fruits with buttery flavor. Compact, nearly spineless plants have an open habit for ease of harvest (Source: HM)



Y-STAR (PATTY PAN)

Golden saucer-shaped fruits with attractive scalloped edges

Prolific yielder of shiny, yellow, scalloped squash fruits, with light green on the blossom end. Amount of green may vary depending on the level of heat and plant stress. Open plant for easy harvest. Plants begin producing early and remain prolific throughout the season. Excellent flavor; harvest when small and tender

WINTER DENSITY (ROMAINE LETTUCE)

A lettuce for all seasons!

Tightly folded, dark green round heads sit high on the stem for good airflow. Texture is a cross between butterhead and romaine with good flavor all season.

Vibrant green summer lettuce with shiny ruffled leaves and great heat tolerance.

GENOVESE (BASIL)

Best variety for pesto!

Plants are strong producers of dark green, glossy leaves with a characteristic spoon shape, exceptionally tender texture and distinctive sweet flavor excellent in sauces and cooking.

Fast-growing variety great for cut-and-come-again.

Good flavor and excellent upright habit for easy harvesting.

Flat, large-leaved variety with aromatic leaves and excellent culinary quality.

GERMAN WINTER THYME

The standard winter-hardy thyme.

Good flavor and yield. Classic culinary and ornamental herb. Small, round to needle-shaped evergreen leaves on woody stems. Mulch in cold winter climates. Edible Flowers: The flowers are small, but have a mild thyme flavor. Use the flowers in potato dishes and salads.

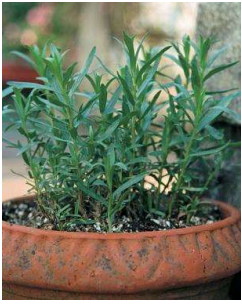


ROSEMARY

Pine-scented, savory, culinary favorite

A rich, aromatic herb. Easy to grow, lightly fragrant and disease and pest resistant. Grows perfect in a wide range of temperatures. To overwinter, take plants indoors or mulch heavily. The silvery green plant does best in well-drained soil, Prefers full sun

FRENCH TARRAGON (TARRAGON)

Commonly grown temperate-zone tarragon used for culinary purposes for its sweet anise flavor.

Plants grow up to 24 inches high and 12 inches wide in two years. The leaves are narrow, up to 2 inches long, and have a fresh green color.

Clip the leaves into salads and on top of soups, to flavor sauces (in traditional béarnaise sauce it is an essential ingredient). It is particularly good with shellfish, fish, chicken, and turkey.

CATNIP

Beloved by cats but also an ornamental and medicinal with relaxing properties.

Dry leaves for a year-round cat treat, leaving flowers as an offering for the bees. Vigorous, high-yielding plants.

NASTURTIUMS -KALEIDOSCOPE MIX

Add excitement to any garden bed or container.

All the traditional bright colors (red, rose, yellow, orange, and cream) with the added plus of marvelous swirled bicolors. Plants have a climbing and trailing habit

Use the flowers as garnishes, in salads, or stuff with soft cheese or mince and add to butters. The immature seed heads can be pickled. Peppery-flavored foliage is also edible.

ALYSSUM (BENEFICIAL FLOWERS)

Attracts and supports beneficial insects.

Perfect for use in rock gardens or used as a border or edge of any flower garden. This fast and low growing, trouble-free plant is making it a popular choice for use as beneficial insect habitat in vegetable and fruit production. Because of its very manageable plant habit, this is a good choice for beneficial planting in greenhouses and containers, in addition to outdoor production. Prefers full sun

CALENDULA - FLASHBACK MIX

Spectacular mix of colors with bicolor petals.

The undersides of the petals are a muted burgundy giving the 1 1/2–3" flowers a unique, flashy appearance. An excellent mix of colors; high percentage of double and semidouble flowers on long, strong stems.

Petals of the flowers can be used fresh or dried in "flower confetti," soups, soufflés, rice dishes, baked goods, and to garnish desserts. Calendula is a popular choice for brightening up salad mix. Flavor is tangy and slightly bitter. Remove the petals from the flower base before consuming as the base can be quite bitter. Prefers sun/partial shade.

CHERRY BRANDY (RUDBECKIA)

unique cherry to deep-red blooms

2-3" wide Flowers. It gives impressive garden performance enduring heat, drought and poor soil. Can be planted in drifts, along borders or in large containers and can also be used as a cut flower. Prefers full sun

AFTERNOON WHITE (COSMOS)

Large, pure white blooms on strong stems.

In our trials, it produces strong, straight stems and 2–4" white blooms with bright yellow centers. Early to flower. A good cut-flower choice. Prefers full sun

VERSAILLE MIX (COSMOS)

Early blooming and vigorous.

Strong stems can withstand considerable handling. Blooms are 2 1/2" across in shades of blush pink, pure white, carmine red, and pink with a deep pink eye. Prefers full sun

SUNDAY GOLD (CELOSIA)

Vibrant and uniform plumes.

Uniform, productive plants. 4–8" long, bright golden-yellow, feathery spikes on long stems. Rich color complements high-summer and autumn arrangements. Prefers full sun

PAMPAS PLUME (CELOSIA)

Huge airy plumes in a wide variety of colours.

Masses of soft, feathery, 2–6" long plumes in scarlet, orange, bright yellow, pink, cream. Multi-branching plants produce 10–14 stems each. Best for drying and cutting. Prefers full sun

MADAM BUTTERFLY MIX (SNAPDRAGON)

This is where you will find the butterflies.

Breathtaking multi-coloured fully, fluffy double ruffled petals with a Victorian look. Flowers come in stunning shades that are long lasting. This mix consists of bronze/white, cherry/bronze, ivory, pink, red, rose, yellow and bronze blooms. The stalks grow 24-36", making them ideal as a cut flower. Prefers full sun

CHANTILLY PURPLE (SNAPDRAGON)

Early, open-faced flowers.

Bloom color is a vibrant, deep, rosy purple. The edible flowers are a colorful garnish for use in salads, desserts, and drinks. The flavor is floral and slightly bitter, so use sparingly. Prefers full sun

MILKWEED - BUTTERFLY WEED

The hardy native milkweed is essential to the survival of Monarch butterflies.

Mature butterflies feed on the nectar produced in the flowers, while the foliage provides food for their larvae. The brilliant orange and yellow flowers are showy in massed plantings, but fascinating up close, with their intricate detail. The three-foot plant is usually preferring drier sites. Very durable and long-lived once established. Prefers full sun.

CAUTION: The milky sap is poisonous if ingested in large quantities, and contact with the skin may cause dermatitis in sensitive individuals.

MARIGOLD - QUEEN SOPHIA

Dark orange petals rimmed in gold.

A favorite around the world. 2 1/2–3" blooms attract beneficial insects such as hoverflies. Leaves of the plant are edible and are used as flavorful salad greens and garnish. Use the flowers to dress up salads and desserts or cooked in egg or rice dishes. Flavor is floral with hints of citrus and spice, and slightly bitter. Remove the petals from the flower base before consuming as the base can be quite bitter. Prefers full sun

MARIGOLD - WHITE SWAN

Creamy white marigold.

2–3" cream-colored, fully double, uniform blooms borne on productive, sturdy, uniform plants. High-quality blooms produce a mild, sweet, marshmallow fragrance, without the typical strong marigold scent. Use the flowers to dress up salads and desserts or cooked in egg or rice dishes. Flavor is floral with hints of citrus and spice, and slightly bitter. Remove the petals from the flower base before consuming as the base can be quite bitter. Prefers full sun

STRAWFLOWER - MONSTROSUM TALL MIX

Large, brilliant flowers on tall, sturdy stems.

Plants are tall and robust, with wider (1 1/2–3") blooms in shades of gold, orange, magenta, pink, and rose. Great for dried flowers. Prefers full sun.

ZINNIA - BENARYS GIANT MIX

The premium zinnia.

Vigorous all-season producers hold up well in summer rain and heat. Densely petaled blooms are up to 6" across. Long-lasting standouts in bouquets. Cut-and-come-again flower, yielding multiple cuts over the season.
